United Way of Williamson County Day of Caring – September 23rd 13 projects. 10 Agencies. 4 Cities. One County.

WILLIAMSON COUNTY, Texas – On September 23rd, volunteers will take on 13 projects benefitting 10 agencies and schools in 4 cities in Williamson County as part of the Fall Day of Caring sponsored by United Way of Williamson County (UWWC).

This annual event invites individuals, families, groups and businesses to help local nonprofit agencies and schools with projects that will benefit children and families across Williamson County. Whether it is sorting donations of food and clothing, helping to organize a “mobile library” to serve disadvantaged children, painting offices and meeting space, or tackling landscaping and beautification projects, volunteers can make a significant impact where they live and work.

This collaborative effort between United Way of Williamson County and The Volunteer Center calls for over 150 volunteers to complete 13 projects for 10 agencies and schools at sites in Georgetown, Leander, Taylor and Round Rock. The response from agencies requesting projects has seen a significant increase over last year growing to 13 projects this year from 3 last year.

New this year will be a kickoff breakfast for all the volunteers at Dell Diamond starting at 8:15 a.m. This is a great opportunity for volunteers to fill up on great food from H-E-B, meet others who are making an impact on the community, grab a Day of Caring t-shirt, and receive a fabulous send-off from United Way staff and volunteers. The kickoff event is sponsored by Ceva Logistics.
