### United Way of Williamson County Day of Caring – September 10<sup>th</sup> Focusing on Impacting Children and Families

**WILLIAMSON COUNTY, Texas** – September 10<sup>th</sup> has been appropriately named a Day of Caring by United Way of Williamson County (UWWC). On that day individuals, families, groups and businesses are invited to join in a morning of volunteer projects that will benefit children and families across Williamson County. Because we can accomplish so much more by working together than we can individually UWWC, in partnership with The Volunteer Center, is hoping to engage more than one hundred volunteers in making a difference right here in our community.

“Imagine the potential of over a hundred volunteers giving just a few hours of their time on the morning of September 10<sup>th</sup>,” said LeAnn Powers, Chief Professional Officer of United Way of Williamson County. “We have three great opportunities where the collective efforts of volunteers can make a truly remarkable impact on children and youth - from pre-school to high school. Joining together in volunteer opportunities such as these really embodies what it means to LIVE UNITED, the ongoing theme we embrace and advocate at United Way of Williamson County.”

Three volunteer sites, one in the northern part of the County and two in the southern part, offer a variety of ways to get involved. At Berry Springs Park, just north of Georgetown, a partnership with Williamson County will have volunteers creating a *Born Learning Trail*. The *Born Learning Trail* is a series of fun, outdoor games posted on engaging signs that offer parents and caregivers the opportunity to create learning opportunities for a young child. In addition to the creation of the *Trail* at the park, there will be several landscape improvement projects.

In the Round Rock area, one of the volunteer sites is The Neighborhood Conference Committee building. A program of LifeSteps, this project will have volunteers cleaning and painting in and around the building in preparation for their fall program that focuses on keeping kids in school. The other site is at the WBC Opportunities Round Rock Head Start site where volunteers will help create a safer playground for the children in their program.
